

Taltz is for adult patients with active ankylosing spondylitis and active psoriatic arthritis. Taltz is also a treatment for adults with moderate to severe plaque psoriasis who may benefit from taking injections or pills (systemic therapy) or phototherapy (treatment using ultraviolet or UV light).

TALTZ COVERED BY INSURANCE

If you are commercially insured and your insurance plan covers Taltz, you'll pay as little as \$5 a month for up to 36 months.*

*By using the Taltz Savings Card ("Card"), you attest that you meet the eligibility criteria, agree to and will comply with the Terms and Conditions described below: If you meet program eligibility requirements, have commercial drug insurance, and your insurance provider covers Taltz, you are eligible to pay as little as \$5 monthly, subject to a monthly cap of wholesale acquisition cost plus usual and customary pharmacy charges and a separate maximum annual benefit of \$16,000. If you meet program eligibility requirements, have commercial drug insurance, and your insurance provider denies coverage for Taltz, you are eligible to pay \$25 monthly, subject to a monthly and annual cap of wholesale acquisition cost plus usual and customary pharmacy charges. To continue to participate in the \$25 monthly program, patients who qualify are required to initiate a benefits investigation and request for coverage within 6 months post program initiation, as well as 12 months post program initiation, to verify coverage status and potential eligibility for the \$5 monthly program. Once activated, the Card for both the \$5 and \$25 monthly offers is good for up to 36 months from patient qualification into the program and patients must first use their Card by 12/31/2019. 

If you are commercially insured but your insurance plan does not cover Taltz, we will work with you and your insurance company to see if they will provide coverage. If you are denied coverage, you will pay as little as \$25 a month for up to 36 months.*

1 • RECEIVE YOUR PRESCRIPTION

If you're commercially insured and have enrolled in Taltz Together, your prescription will be authorized to ship in as little as 2 days.* Your doctor may then send your prescription to Taltz Together, where someone will be able to help you navigate the insurance approval process.

Prescriptions for Taltz need to be filled by a specialty pharmacy, so sometimes processing your prescription may take a little longer.

2 YOU'VE BEEN APPROVED— NOW EXPECT A CALL!

Taltz Together will inform you as to which specialty pharmacies can fill your prescription. The specialty pharmacy then calls you to set up delivery of Taltz to your home. To ensure delivery, please be sure to answer any calls, as it might be your specialty pharmacy.




TALTZ IS AVAILABLE IN 2 DIFFERENT DEVICES

AUTOINJECTOR



PREFILLED SYRINGE



EASY TO USE

At first use, over **94% of patients** agreed the Taltz autoinjector was "easy to use" and were confident in their ability to use it. Please see Instructions for Use included with the device.

SELECT IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION

Taltz may cause or worsen symptoms of Crohn's disease or ulcerative colitis (inflammatory bowel disease). Tell your doctor if you have any of these symptoms or if they get worse: stomach pain, diarrhea, and weight loss.

AUTOINJECTOR & PREFILLED SYRINGE

Even if you have given yourself an injection before, it is important to know that the Taltz autoinjector has different instructions from any device you may have used in the past.



Take your device out of the refrigerator and let it sit for 30 minutes to warm to room temperature. Wash your hands, select an injection site, and clean it with an alcohol wipe. Let the injection site dry before you inject.

AUTOINJECTOR

1 | UNCAP THE AUTOINJECTOR

Twist off cap and throw it away. Do not put the base cap back on, as this could damage the needle. Do not touch the needle.



2 | PLACE & UNLOCK

Place firmly at the injection site and unlock autoinjector.



3 | PRESS, HOLD, AND LISTEN

Press and hold the green button. Listen for a loud click. When you hear the second click, that means the full dose has been delivered.



IMPORTANT: These are not the complete instructions for using your device. Please see Instructions for Use that come with your device or visit **taltz.com.** Before you or your caregiver inject for the first time, your healthcare provider should show you how to prepare and inject Taltz.

Once you've completed the injection, dispose of the used device in a Taltz sharps container or another puncture-resistant container with a secure lid. Do not dispose of Taltz in household trash. PREFILLED SYRINGE

1 UNCAP THE SYRINGE

Do not put the needle cap back on, as this could damage the needle. Do not touch the needle.



2 | PINCH & INSERT

Pinch and hold a fold of skin, and insert needle at a 45-degree angle.



3 | PUSH IN THE PLUNGER

You will know your injection is complete when the green plunger rod shows through the syringe.


SELECT IMPORTANT STORAGE INFORMATION

Store Taltz in the refrigerator and protect from light. **Do not** freeze Taltz. **Do not** use Taltz if it has been frozen. **Do not** shake your Taltz device.

MAINTAIN DATE

If you have both psoriatic arthritis and moderate to severe plaque psoriasis, follow the dosing schedule for plaque psoriasis below.

HELPFUL INJECTION TIPS

Talk to your doctor about whether the tips below may help with the injection of biologics.*



You may experience side effects while taking Taltz. If you do, please reach out to your doctor.



Placing something cold (such as an ice gel pack or cold water bottle) on the injection site before and after the injection may help reduce pain.



Acetaminophen may help relieve pain.



Antihistamines or topical corticosteroids may help with itching or swelling caused by the injection.



Choose different injection sites each time you inject.

The recommended places for injection are your stomach (abdomen) or thigh, and another person may give you the injection in the back of your arm.

TIPS SPECIFIC TO TALTZ



You should take Taltz out of the refrigerator and let it sit for 30 minutes to warm to room temperature before injecting. Leave the cap on the device while it is warming up to room temperature.



However, Taltz should not be microwaved, run under hot water, or left in direct sunlight.



There are 2 devices available for injecting Taltz: an autoinjector and a prefilled syringe.

SELECT IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION

The most common side effects of Taltz include: injection site reactions, upper respiratory infections, nausea and fungal infections. Tell your doctor if you have any side effects. You can report side effects at 1-800-FDA-1088 or www.fda.gov/medwatch.

INJECTION SITE REACTIONS

Injection site reactions may include injection site pain, redness, and possibly swelling of the skin.

- Injection site pain may occur while you are injecting.
 Other reactions, such as redness, may happen after several days
- Most injection site reactions did not cause people to stop taking Taltz
- In clinical trials, most injection site reactions were mild to moderate. Talk to your doctor about any injection site reactions

If you are experiencing injection site reactions with one type of device, talk to your doctor about whether it might be appropriate to switch to the other Taltz device.

THE OTHER MOST COMMON SIDE EFFECTS INCLUDE:

- Upper respiratory infections
- Nausea

Fungal infections

These are not all of the possible side effects of Taltz. Serious side effects may occur. Tell your healthcare provider about any side effect that bothers you or that does not go away. Call your doctor for medical advice about side effects. You are encouraged to report negative side effects of prescription drugs to the FDA. Visit **fda.gov/medwatch** or call **1-800-FDA-1088**.


TAKING TALTZ & STORAGE

Before using Taltz, be sure to read the Instructions for Use, visit **taltz.com** to watch the injection training videos, or have Taltz Together connect you to a nurse for an over-the-phone, in-person, or online discussion about injection training.



WHEN TAKING TALTZ, PLEASE REMEMBER

- You may inject the medicine into your stomach (abdomen) or thigh
- Another person may give you the injection in the back of your arm
- Alternate your injection site. Do not inject in the exact same spot every time
- **Do not** inject within 1 inch of your belly button
- **Do not** give an injection into areas where the skin is tender, bruised, red, or hard, or in an area of skin that is affected by psoriasis
- Before you or your caregiver inject for the first time, your doctor should show you how to prepare and inject Taltz



Even if you have given yourself an injection before, it is important to know that the Taltz autoinjector has different instructions from any device you may have used in the past.

STORING TALTZ

- Keep Taltz stored in the refrigerator between 2°C to 8°C (36°F to 46°F) and make sure you do not freeze it
- When you are ready to use your device, take it out of the fridge and let it sit for 30 minutes to warm to room temperature before injecting
- If you drop your device on a hard surface, do not use it.

 Use a new one for your injection. Always handle carefully
- If needed, you may store Taltz at room temperature up to 30°C (86°F) for up to 5 days in the original carton to protect from light. Once Taltz has been stored at room temperature, do not return to the refrigerator and discard, if unused, within 5 days
- Keep Taltz and all medicines out of the reach of children



Do not use Taltz if it has been frozen



You should protect Taltz from light at all times



Do not shake your Taltz device

Remember to talk to your doctor about any other questions you may have.

SELECT IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION

Before you use Taltz, make sure your doctor knows if you are being treated for an infection, have an infection that does not go away or keeps coming back or have symptoms of an infection such as fever, cough, sores, diarrhea or other symptoms; have TB or have been in close contact with someone with TB; have Crohn's disease or ulcerative colitis.

- With active psoriatic arthritis.
- With active ankylosing spondylitis.

Before using

Before you use Taltz, review these questions with your doctor:

- Are you being treated for an infection?
- Do you have an infection that does not go away or keeps coming back?
- Do you have TB or have you been in close contact with someone with TB?
- Do you have possible symptoms of an infection such as fever, cough, sores, diarrhea, or other symptoms? Ask your doctor about other possible symptoms
- Do you have Crohn's disease or ulcerative colitis?

Tell your doctor if:

- You need any vaccines or have had one recently.
- You are under age 18. Taltz has not been approved in people under 18 years of age.
- You take prescription or over-the-counter medicines, vitamins, or herbal supplements.
- You are pregnant or planning to become pregnant. It is not known if Taltz can harm an unborn baby.
- You are breastfeeding or planning to breastfeed. It is not known if Taltz passes into breastmilk.
